It is Departmental policy that, to pass online classes, everyone **MUST** take and pass the ON CAMPUS portion of the course, that is two tests and the final Exam (40 out of 80 total points). There is a total of 120% and so the worst test will be dropped or if the exam is the worst score of the three than it counts only 20 %. The tests and exam are written on campus (not on the computer) and photo identification is required. The homework grade will be based primarily on effort. There will be 5 Chapter quizzes on MyLabsPlus to be written when we finish the corresponding Chapter (there is a late penalty).

It is important to monitor email, attend online classes and to not neglect the course, even briefly. Email or telephone the instructor with any concerns. Computer based grading (of quizzes and homework) is not perfect: if you detect a problem, speak up.

Test and Exam Policy: No graphing calculators will be allowed for the on campus tests or the final exam because graphing is a portion of the course. Scientific calculators are allowed but not needed. (Some of the assignment problems expect a scientific calculator.) A single page formula sheet will be allowed for the on campus test and final exam.
